New funding available for Livingstone's bicentenary

We are delighted to announce that, thanks to the Scottish Government, funding is available to allow even more people to participate in the Bicentenary of Dr David Livingstone.

A new £50,000 fund has been made available for events and activities that extend participation in **David Livingstone 200**, broaden the scope of the programme and also, importantly, help promote awareness of opportunities in international volunteering and encourage new international contacts between Scotland and Africa. Grants, of between £500 - £10,000 will be awarded in two rounds - one in March and one in May.

You can apply for up to 90% of the costs of events and activities that meet the funding criteria (detailed below) using the application form [available here](#).

Funding criteria

We will consider applications for events and activities that:

- Allow more people to participate in the Bicentenary of Dr David Livingstone



- Provide a wider cultural context to the Bicentenary
- Have historical or educational merit
- Introduce Livingstone to new audiences and communities
- Increase awareness of volunteering opportunities in support international development and help build new contacts and networks particularly with Malawi and Zambia.



To qualify for funding:

- Events should be delivered between 01 March 2013 and 31 March 2014
- Events should be clearly identified as part of the David Livingstone 200 programme (and branded as such)
- Events should be open to members of the public and publicly advertised on www.davidlivingstone200.org and related marketing
- Events should have a Scotland-based element - although events that contain international elements will be considered providing they meet the funding qualifications (detailed in the application form)
- Party-political events will not be funded
- A minimum of 10% cash costs of the event or activity should be met by the applicant (through cash contribution, ticket sales, sponsorship or partnership funding)
- Grants are available of £500 - £10,000 per application.

There are two application rounds:

- Applications for the March round must be received by David Livingstone 200 by 13 March 2013
- Applications for the May round must be received by David Livingstone 200 by 9 May 2013.
