My Dear Sir  
On searching  
for the address you  
requested, I find  
that I cannot lay  
my hands on it.  
A young man in  
D<sup>r</sup> Hamilton's church  
Regent's Square  
London told me  
about M<sup>r</sup> Silva's  
proposed visit  
& said that on his

young man gave  
me his card but  
expecting him to  
communicate I  
took no care of it

From your  
further explanations  
it seems that  
you do not so  
much need the  
information  
that M<sup>r</sup> Silva can  
give. No obstacle

a settler, but I question  
whether he could  
take notes of testa-  
ments through the  
custom house at  
the beginning of

his career. When  
a person is known  
to the officers they  
are not so illiberal.  
Your plan seems  
more feasible  
now than it did
